

River Lyvennet

From March 15th 2020

Appleby AA has recently acquired approximately 1.5 miles of fishing on the River Lyvennet near Cliburn. This is for members only, no day or guest tickets or exchange tickets, and is for the trout season only.

This is a beautiful stretch of small river which holds just wild brown trout and needs to be stalked with care so as not to put spooky fish down.

Due to the size of this water the club is strictly limiting it to 2 anglers on any one day.

Tickets are not available from Pigneys.

Members wishing to fish must book in advance by ringing one of the numbers below.

Please ring 07828 575185 to book.

Anyone not abiding by these rules will be asked to leave the river immediately. The stretch will be closely monitored by club officials and also by the resident gamekeeper on the Crossrigg House Estate.

This is a fly only water, barbless, and catch and release in order to preserve stocks.

The use of streamers or lures of any kind are strictly prohibited on the Lyvenett. Only dry fly or nymphs to be used.

Please refer to the map for parking. It is probably best to print this document prior to fishing to ensure exact parking sites.

A second parking place is at Morland Bridge, clearly marked on the map.

Please respect the BEAT END signs. Do not go beyond these.

Directions to Crossrigg House Lyvennet Fishing (CA10 3AW)

(1) From the A66

From the A66 take the Bolton turn-off. Follow this road for approximately 2 miles. You will see a turning on the right signposted Temple Sowerby and Ousenstand. 100 yards past this on your left is Crossrigg Hall, a large country house. Immediately before the gates is a small lane with a wooden bridleway sign. Do not drive down the track to the river. Park on the main road.

When you fish from the bottom of the beat up, you will see a BEAT END sign just after the wooden footbridge. Stop here and return to your car. The land ahead is strictly private. Drive approximately ½ mile back towards Bolton and turn right at a signpost for Morland. After ¼ mile you will come to Morland Bridge. Park here. Walk downstream for approximately ½ mile right bank looking downstream until you see a

BEAT START sign. From here you can fish all the way up, past the bridge to the weir at Lyvenett Mill. Please stop at the BEAT END sign. Do not fish beyond this sign.

(2) From Penrith

Go through Eamont Bridge and follow the A6 for approximately 1 mile. Take the road signed to Cliburn on your left. Follow this road for approximately 4 miles. On entering Cliburn keep straight on and over the stone bridge at Cliburn Mill. Continue for a few hundred yards. At the top of the small hill is Crossrigg Hall. Look for a narrow lane on the right with a wooden bridleway sign. Do not drive down the track to the river. Park on the main road.

Please park in such a manner that you are not blocking any access points to the surrounding properties.

All vehicles must display a AAA sticker on the windscreen. These are available from Pigneys Ironmongers in Appleby for 50p each.
